## Brown Bag Research Presentation

The second BFSA Brown Bag Research Presentation will be held on October 31. Dr. Barbara Turnage, Assistant Professor in the School of Social Work, will present her research on Wednesday, October 31 from 11:30 AM to 1:00 PM in the Student Union, Sand Key room 220. Her presentation title is "Obtainable Images of African American Womanhood Supports Adolescent American Females' Global Self-Esteem." This event is co-sponsored by BFSA and the African American Studies Program.

## BFSA Membership
