not the letter yesterday but as for my liberty there is
nothing done at present & Iaylor would not send me
I should go home but he said if my master could
get an order from under the Sherrifs hand he would let
us all go home so if my master is gone to war-
rington to see if he can do any thing with the Sherrif
and he says he will send me a letter by post from
warrington what he hath done in the thing so I will
not have thee to come before thou hear either
from me or my master, & my master was very
loving & respectful towards me; he brought me
some verses from a maior wth I have left several
friends with me: for Mr. Dunn & several other
eminent friends & they approve of them very much
& their desire is that he will be faithfull to what
he knows ~~and~~ ^{my} dear love to him returning
& my Aunt I have sent her to her and to all my
