when thou wilt com home, which I route also desire
thou might som tyme look to y^e shop for a month or
fiv weeks for I have a desire to goe to london
to look after my busines there, thou might
worke with mary Hunter, hir Brother hath sent
som good from london for me to dispose for him, &
his maister also hath sent to me to buy him 2 year
of fustian, for when I had dur y^e ordered my
own busines & thou route som I woud goe up
they have fined & strained of severall friends
for thwy meeting I was at Congleton y^e day where
was John Goose his wife & J. Gubbs we were visit
ed there by y^e major & there but I have not heard
y^e any thing is don at yett concerning y^e all it quiet
heard, but what I have said I hear y^e they are
very bad about midle-wich & Collyer & Chester
but I heard y^e shakerley said at som meeting
of thwors y^e they needed not to goe out for our
meeting our a quarter might serve, now y^e informed
& referred them thwre a week, y^e was the occasion
for with my love to m. f. & y^e rest of thy fellow
prisoners & friends in prison with my wife & child
thou also ed. Thomas & it to thee I have reciev'd
severall letters from thee the ffarmers I and
brooth love it to thee thou must remember y^e shob
to frankis dur for with thy friends desiring to
see thee heard if it woud for our red
