We have had a number of inquiries as to the exact date of the closed season on Salt Water Trout. Ed. Brown says this comes under the jurisdiction of the Shellfish commission and is from June 15th to July 15th. In some parts of the state the law is interpreted to cover commercial fishing with seines and does not apply to hook and line fishermen, however there are no exemptions given in the law. If the shellfish commission do not enforce this law any better than they do the law against seining in inlets, fishermen need have no cause to worry.
