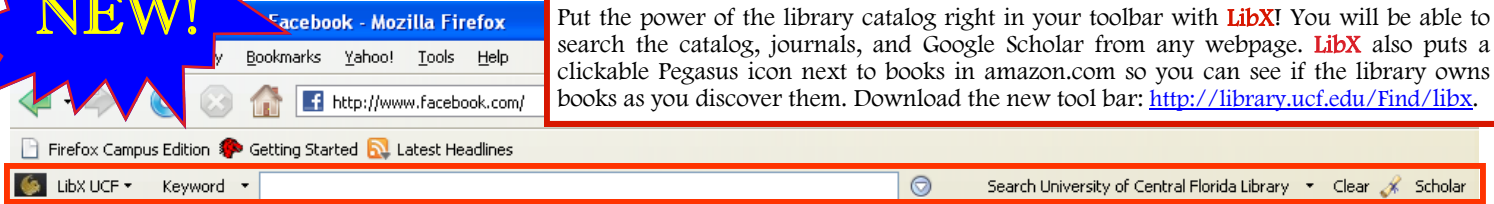

## UCF LIBRARY TOOLBAR

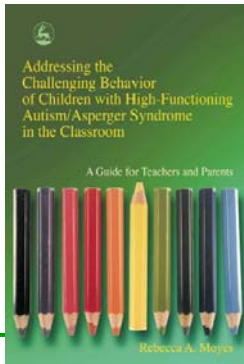
Put the power of the library catalog right in your toolbar with **LibX**! You will be able to search the catalog, journals, and Google Scholar from any webpage. **LibX** also puts a clickable Pegasus icon next to books in amazon.com so you can see if the library owns books as you discover them. ## April is National Autism Awareness Month

In February 2007, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention issued their ADDME autism prevalence report. The report, which looked at a sample of 8 year olds in 2000 and 2002, concluded that the prevalence of autism had risen to 1 in every 150 American children, and almost 1 in 94 boys. Autism is a complex developmental disability that typically appears during the first three years of life and is the result of a neurological disorder that affects the normal functioning of the brain, impacting development in the areas of social interaction and communication skills. Both children and adults with autism typically show difficulties in verbal and non-verbal communication, social interactions, and leisure or play activities.
