 forth, for truly my friend though low- confin'd in y^e for, my
 low- is free, for which I doo-ly salute thee, whos^e truly
 low- in the Lord, and whos^e prosperity in the truth I doo-ly see as
 my for my own- soule, and the Lord hath rais'd this low- in
 my heart towards thee, god almighty y^e for- thee- & m^ore-
 worthy of his low- whos^e hath low'd thee, in whos^e low- our
