My Dear & well-belov'd

Friend Roger Haydock Although thou be confin'd in Bonds  
(but not in the Spirit) Remote from me yet in the outward  
flowings of Love & Life w<sup>th</sup> I am at this time and you  
near & Dear unto me, & I do embrace you in the arms  
of Love & kiss you w<sup>th</sup> an holy kiss, & being just fill'd  
w<sup>th</sup> Love ~~and~~ shining out towards you in J: w<sup>th</sup> I begot it  
could not but signify some thing thereof unto you also  
my tongue is too short to declare it yet I desire I may  
be full of you, as I many a time have felt you as I  
do now & have felt you in the many heavenly opportunities  
w<sup>th</sup> hath been afforded, by our God, who is worthy of praises  
for they are not few who do so largely extend their  
kindness & mercy daily to those J: love him & wait upon  
him, my dear love it is to be desired of thy fellow prisoners  
who are suffering w<sup>th</sup> you, for the truth of Jesus, ~~will be but~~  
for a season ~~for~~ Lord I am persuaded in its own due time, will work  
your deliverance Altho the Sons of men combine together  
ag<sup>st</sup> you for he will not suffer any thing to be done to  
any who are faithfully given up to do his will but what  
will addound to his glory & honour, I do demand  
thy in the love where w<sup>th</sup> I have already saluted you  
thy friend
