I am safe to my hand which  
brings the news of thy well being every <sup>way</sup> ~~where~~

all a meeting of last night at friends Chamber  
where was G.F. G.W. A.P. J. Vauton nity many more  
& I did acquaint y<sup>m</sup> with what the writ & of  
thy travels: & that thee had not returned  
alme from England since thee cam there, thou  
had writ to divers, but G.F. did answer too  
had writ about 3 weeks ago to Amsterdam  
but it was to Potter. H: as to how things  
goe here we have our meeting pretty now  
againe meeting yesterday (& in) at Graft-hurst  
street, where there was againe p<sup>r</sup>sons of the  
Lord with us, to the refreshing & consolating  
many a hungry p<sup>r</sup>ting soul, who cannot be  
at rest till ye feed his blessed p<sup>r</sup>son: as to  
our meetings at Lathlife y<sup>e</sup> be quiet, but much  
visited by those people of the worse sort called  
in former, the last sessions we put in 7 weeks  
from our parts, & to be tryed y<sup>e</sup> next session but  
nevertheless the less our bowe abid in strength, &  
dare not forsake our assembling our selves  
to gather as too many doe for feare of men  
but put our confidence in him who at all  
times hath been ap<sup>r</sup>sent helpe in the time of  
trouble: & in him our constant wholly depend, &  
dare not lean upon any thing els for their defense,  
(this with my love to thee in y<sup>e</sup> blessed truth that  
never change)
