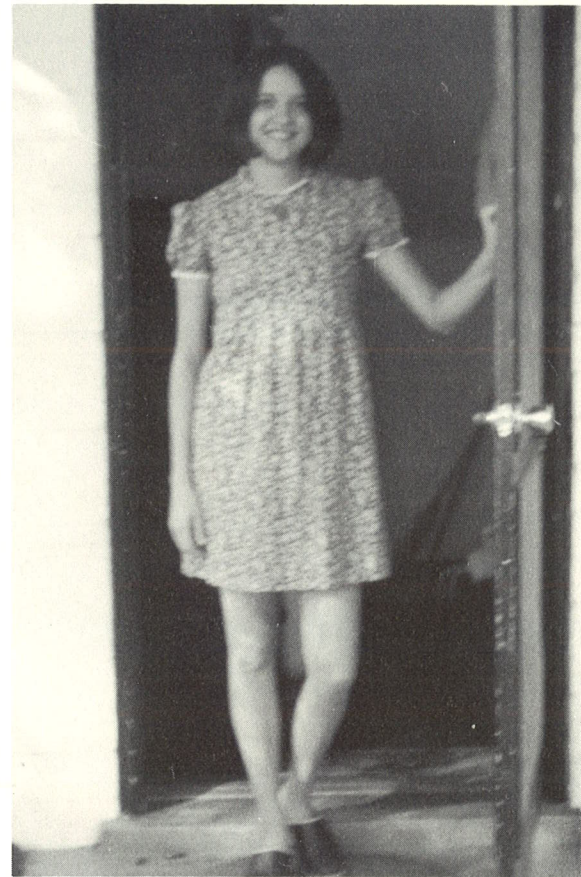
Miss Senior
