fares, and I have writen 3. or 4. times to you since I went from England
and I write to you since I came down into the Low Countries about a mo:
ago, I was then going into fros Land and ambon, where I have had good
famines, and I desired to a had a few lines from you, which I have not
had as yet, I desired in my last to hear from you, and ordered how you
might direct it to fros Swigg. at Gallisteter, it may be it did misfarie
well Dear friends my desire is to hear from you, for my Love in the Low
Dutch often come thence me to wards you, in abundance more then my
tongue or pen can express, O the largenes of the Low off ever gods
we know one another in his blessed truth, O the times and seasons
of Refreshments, which hath come from the hand of the Low, by
Refreshment of ever felices, glory and honor and everlasting Renown
be given to his name for ever, I have formerly given you amount in
short of my travels, in these countries, the Lords power and grace
gents hath been and is my support, and hath carried me through
all and over all difficulties, and his name and truth spreads a
broad and many are inquiring the way to him, and the Lords day
is founded in these parts, and many are allvamed, and the Lord is with
is servants who goes forth in his name and in his power, his presence
is enjoyed, which is more then borne wine and oyle, blessed be his name
for ever, who is my Reward, and not mine only but also all the saints
full, for now Dear friends my Love is to you all, and the god of my
life be with you all, and bless you all, in his heavenly Love and
life and good and power, that is ever blessed for ever, for Dear
friends I hope to be in England in 2. or 3. weekes time (if the Lord
will if winds serve) ~~Let me have a line or two from you direct
it to ...~~ god with my Love to all friends, ~~and
inquire after ...~~ and you all, I have well
