deare friend and well beloved in y^e face of life I dearly love
brother thee, and salute thee with thy deare wife, son and daugh-
ter, and the rest of y^e family, and all friends who may
desire to heare from mee, and of my safe & Rinall at Ire-
land, I take shipping that evening that I departed with thee, we
went down to Blacke Rocks, and by thine till: y^e 6. day
morning and then we had a severe wind that day and was
in y^e sight of Ireland in y^e evening, and I landed about 2. or: 12
on y^e 7. day, where friends embraced mee verie gladlie
and said I am as if I had beene called thine being no fre-
ind, in y^e town, and on y^e first day we had: 2. verie good
meetings, and y^e people as quiet and still as y^e had beene
for some time before, and y^e after day was y^e wemens
meeting, and I went amongst them, and y^e Lords power
was with mee, and things opened in mee, to y^e opening of
