deare friend and well beloved in y<sup>e</sup> fear of life I doerly see  
 breare thee, and salute thee with thy deare wife, son and daugh-  
 ter, and the rest of y<sup>e</sup> family, and all friends who may  
 desire to heare from mee, and of my safe & Quall at Ire-  
 land, I take shipping that evening that I departed with thee, we  
 went downe to Blacke Rocks, and by thine till y<sup>e</sup> 6. day  
 morning and then we had a severe wind that day and when  
 in y<sup>e</sup> sight of Ireland in y<sup>e</sup> evening, and I landed about 2. or 12  
 on y<sup>e</sup> 7. day, where friends remained very gladly  
 and said I am as if I had beene called thine being no fre-  
 ind, in y<sup>e</sup> town, and on y<sup>e</sup> first day we had 2. very good  
 meetings, and people as quiet and still as y<sup>e</sup> had beene  
 for some time before, and y<sup>e</sup> after day was y<sup>e</sup> wemens  
 meeting, and I went amongst them, and y<sup>e</sup> Lords power  
 was with mee, and things opened in mee to y<sup>e</sup> opening of  
 thine understandings, and y<sup>e</sup> wiser broken and much tendered,  
 for thine was some range, Thomas Innes of Dublin had  
 beene thine, with a fountaine testimonie in y<sup>e</sup> meeting on y<sup>e</sup>  
 first day, and many being taken with him, hee after-  
 wards, goes to some friends house, Justis finding Jo: story y<sup>e</sup>  
 all y<sup>e</sup> had beene charged against him nothing could be proved  
 but y<sup>e</sup> wemens meeting being y<sup>e</sup> second day after hee being  
 in y<sup>e</sup> town did not come at it, and y<sup>e</sup> 3. day y<sup>e</sup> mens meeting  
 I went out of town, to wards willow and, I found  
 y<sup>e</sup> which is y<sup>e</sup> best ground to sow but good, but I praye  
 y<sup>e</sup> Lord will to get out of town this week after him  
 this day is y<sup>e</sup> mens meeting thine, and y<sup>e</sup> fifth day is thine  
 weekly meeting and after y<sup>e</sup> I hope to get out of town  
 things thine it shall well, all quiet and still, and I am  
 very well every way blessed by y<sup>e</sup> god of my-  
 life for ever who is worthie over all heaven and earth  
 from everlasting to everlasting god blessed for ever I rest assured
