Deare friend and bro: in y<sup>e</sup> vnderstandable truth in  
which is vnderstandable sound, that never dies, I often  
times remember thee, and y<sup>e</sup> dayes and times of  
refreshments, which we had and do in joy, and  
at this time my heart is full of y<sup>e</sup> love of god to  
wards thee, in which I do very salubly bless  
with thy deare wife and children y<sup>e</sup> whole and all  
y<sup>e</sup> rest of y<sup>e</sup> familie of god: as thou doth remem-  
ber by this thou may vnderstand, I am verie  
well and in way blessed by y<sup>e</sup> name of y<sup>e</sup> god  
of heauen who is our vnderstander, by sea and  
land, and is glorified y<sup>e</sup> power and y<sup>e</sup> presence hath  
immensely appeared amongst vs at this halfe  
yearly meeting, which did begining on y<sup>e</sup>. 6. day of  
this instant and ended this morning, and many friends  
from many parts of y<sup>e</sup> nation, and a verie sweet  
heavenly time, and y<sup>e</sup> Lords power was offer all  
and things is generally well, as to truth asdares  
but verie dangerous times, for y<sup>e</sup> english in this coun-  
try for being robbed and murthered, and great  
feare off y<sup>e</sup> papists arising, I am now bound to  
god for y<sup>e</sup> north: I have beene throwing south and  
west, y<sup>e</sup> did meet with the: but then at board  
and speak to him, and desired him, to visit y<sup>e</sup> nation  
and in a little time he did, I have met with my bro.  
John hee liues with one called y<sup>e</sup> Countess of Mayes  
about ten miles from Dublin, I hoped to see at this  
tittion againe about two months hence, I desire a  
fewe lines from thee, I remember thou speake  
to me about some fallow or latter but y<sup>e</sup> rat-  
les are soe vnseasonable things vnseasonable I did  
and do for beare soe in the west I rest
