Chesham Castle ye 13th of first mo^r. 14th
after my dear Lord remembered unto ¹⁷⁹
and thy wife and father and mother and
friends in the everlasting God of life
that since for ever is my salutation
by these thou may understand I was
not unmindefull of thee, or you to give
an account before now, I was taken out
of the meeting by two informers and was
taken to tower, and Samuell Lawe did
bail for me till the next morning -
and Geo: ydaho brought thy horse to Rob
Lowe that night, and he was taken with
some distemper in his head, Jo: Banguin
thou an account I shall leave that, thy horse
& is dead take 50.00 - off godfrey Atterton
I was taken on the next day to houlm hall
before sharkey and he could not tender
me the oath with out a better justice

me the oath and after much distress
he did committed me, I have not
