may spend some time in a country & come again to ye daily
meeting his love is to thee you all & friends there I shoud
ways, as for market I can give little account of as yett only
this day I have sold Nat: Bland a park of wth hand shee
spoke to holland to gett me those ^{little time} wth thou hath forme
or may have that park of pillows at Susan norries & park
of oliver stoones & wth cloth & of wth Gatharings
indeed all I there is, & if thou can gett a park of 8⁰⁰ or
about 9⁰⁰ or within 6⁰⁰ or 9⁰⁰ I shoud think of those Carmill
ians, I was about 20 or more out of John Smiths of
Beddesham gate they are fished at 3 places & I bad him I
think 15⁰⁰ I shoud might have had them I question not
if they be not gon see if he will sell thee have them, but
desired not I shoud about but be in some hope to gett them
way before thou comest for them Remember me to Rich
