to god out of town on the second day or on the third  
day towards Chelthoston, with: Gibson Dobbinton  
to god, and George Borth these I have all I heard of  
at present I have not a letter out of Holland  
and friends doth expect it mee there, I have not  
found my maier as yeat I am in way and if I get  
any money before I come home I will it wadiv.  
did order, and if not I shall order it, it may be  
I may write again before I come England and if not  
I hope to write from Holland god with my love  
to you all, and friends who may inquire after mee  
in the good of life I rest with you all I have  
will
