& friends theraway are well, only the Informers stir A little  
but not much harme done as yett my father was here  
yestern day his love is to thee & phoebe I do salute thee with  
her deare love, we desire to hear from thee ere thou go out  
of the Coast, of Holland, to hear how thou art & what  
way thou intendst, what is all, but that I am, thy friend  
in true love

They have put 2 or 3 friends  
of mine with in prison

phine has pemberton

my fa in law told me he intended to write in my letter but the prop  
it must ready for going away & he is gone forth, therefore  
thought good to acquaint thee that the Constables have com'n often  
the house entered the warrant, but never got in but once & if  
so be thou had An act of that afore thou went over, my  
mo: in law, Mary Jon Clarke the rest remember their deare  
loves to thee, Lydia asked me to desire thee to buy her  
2 sugar boxes, as thou gave phoebe one, it hath some kind  
of perfume Balsome in it, our deare loves is to thee & phoebe  
& to George Keith if they be with thee, I desire to know whether  
you travel all together what is all but bids thee farewell
