Thou art truly beloved by me with the love that abides, here by thou  
may know that I shall get away for Ireland about noon, & do  
believe I shall have a good passage I have bought a Rh. ship  
sage w<sup>ch</sup> I do intend to take with me it cost me 10<sup>0</sup> 0<sup>0</sup>  
I have left order all my Inn to send this away with the mare  
there is severall friends here that are m<sup>y</sup> friends  
the bravest vessel in the harbor belongs to a friend the town  
is freighting it for virginia that will be for Ireland & I do  
intend to go for I believe it a very good one & c: m<sup>r</sup> is a very  
civil man, my love to my father & father in law when you  
write to him & to mother little An. & the rest in good  
I am very well & hearty w<sup>th</sup> it all being somewhat m<sup>ild</sup>  
but that I am thy husband in the unity of Imortality
