are as followeth
Accounts were haue not $\frac{1}{2}$ a lb
nor maligos I gave three fowls good maligos: giving was want non
Alloue & runnly about 20 shill
Mungoils, wattle
a lot may be
Hog nearly for mobility
some fowls & some of it $\frac{1}{2}$ ball & $\frac{1}{2}$ ball
of all fowls, now haue but one left
of lobe fowls & was want fowls
of mungoils & fowls now to be so & fowls now haue but little
but a bit to eat of the left
that if there be any goods of fowls
to be so fowls few the last way but
for two fowls were that is to be so
both with fowls this last night I believe that fowls will be so
the 3 daye the people of live fowls from war might be the 2 fowls
that fowls have with me but what fowls have not
Have the fowls twill more after night that fowls want away the
shorts due to the 4 daye morning & all that daye but
almost night I observed the wind fowls right fowls for me
running to morrow morning should go to morrow & fowls
I shall keep the fowls but I shall expect the 3 daye
it is very workfull for maligos & fowls now haue so fowls
having no more but low to you all & little Am & P R
if you have any further of fowls fowls now worth by fowls
to morrow - -
