Dublin the 20th 6th mo 1679

with abiding love do I salute thee, I sent thee a letter by the post
dated 10th of August with giving thee a full account of my passage & welfare
& also signifies to thee not to expect another letter from me before
my return but having a convenient opportunity of sending by a
friend to it for Liverpool could not well omit it, lest my other
should be miscarried, & believing thou & fa: & mo: will have a desire
to hear from me, I am very well & hearty but has done no business
at yet, the goods at yet are not cleared from C: Lighters house
I am much troubled I brought over the buttons I do not understand
at yet but C: I shall loose by them no seeming market at yet
for fustians on C: 10th of August I met with abroad Barroff who
was very kind, & respectful to me, & so are friends generally, I
do intend to make as quick a return as I can but do not expect
me yet this good while, my dears love to fa: & mo: & friends
generally & to both C: families to fa: Holland or the wife when there
has an opportunity C: I saw thine son yesterday & he was
well, I have not else but that I am thy husband in true Amity

Some as thou hast gotten up ten pounds besides prime hat from Bolton
moneys forwarded thee to pay I would have thee to
send it & a letter with it ~~to~~ how things are
with you & of what goods is wanting C: may be for me to buy at Liverpool to
Carbys there to be until I call for it
farewell
