in thow thee to us, which is more valued by us & maketh our hearts
more glad then if torn wind & oyle were used, for they are temporall
but this stormall, all things with us are very well blessed by y^e Lord for it
our enemies are very still & quiet at present, & seeme to be much downe
Townley being repulst at y^e quarters before, for his Carriage agt^t phrenesey
& is I judge in most company's much blamed & he findes y^e work hard
then he thought it was when others was in y^e office, or than he thought
when he looks y^e office upon him, his wife & he thought very sore & atly
believe y^e curse of god is upon him & all y^e he hath & oth^r, I was with
Larg^e & over on y^e behalfe of Jo^hn Dattory y^e last y^e day & he told his
suz^r & Tho: Brooks y^e he wote like my word before any man in Boulton
it made them almost amazed, to hear him talke at y^e rate, notwithstanding
their persecution, truth gains ground upon them & people is more
moderat now then mistrant is in office then when Jo^hn Collier or when

thy frind & Brother. — James Harrison

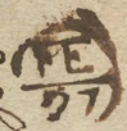
