-right glad to have the few lines ~~just~~ from thee w<sup>ch</sup> did not come  
next week, thou for some time, before being often brought to my  
mind in A living remembrance, I am very glad to hear of thy  
well fare & much glad to hear of thy good service & of thy spirit  
of truth, when thy letter came here I was at Manchester my friend  
Ling & his going dead he in his will reposed some trust in me & has  
been concerned much of the last week in that affair & must go  
again this week he & I believe I had returned the answer &  
the same post thine came by; the wind had <sup>been</sup> ~~much~~ <sup>rather</sup> ~~rather~~ <sup>rather</sup> since  
Roger Haydock went so by; little shipping had com<sup>d</sup> in & so perhaps  
boat had been stopped a good while & we have not had a letter yet  
but have heard of his speedy & safe arrival & do hope he is well
