been concerned much of the last week in that affair & must go
again this week he is of believe I had returned the Answer
the same post thou came by; the wind had ^{been} much softer since
Roger Haydock went so thy little shipping had com^e in & so perhaps
boat had been stoped A good while & we have not had A letter yet
but have heard of his speedy & safe arrival & do hope he is well
Hoskin had went over A little before him but think they might
