welostoomed & dearly beloved friend & bro. in our Lord Jesus
 Christ, unto thee reach the greetings of my life, & saluta-
 tion of brotherly love & cordially give thee, whose remembrance
 lives with mee, having unity with thy life, and following with thy spirit
 in the Covenant of Light with whom (whilst my follen travell?
 conversant in gospell labours) my heart hath often been
 refreshed, and since apart our travells of later tyme have
 been, my spirit also, in y^e tyme thereof even of our remoteness,
 hath often been comforted, and in thee, & in thy faithfull labours
 & travells I am glad, as our rejoicing in this great harvest
 day, that the faithfull labourers are going forth, & travelling
 in; being in my measure comforted amongst them, and service
 of the pow. p^rsonie & blessing of the great Lord of the harvest. He
 attends them, w^{ch} makes them go to & fro upon the earth as
 the children of man, without weariness, or fainting of the
 mind, that the dispersed & scattered sheep may be brought
 to the fold, that the great shepheard of Israel, who
 the sheep are, having gathered them from y^e mouth of she-
 phal that have preyed upon them, do sound & eaton up of them, may
 feed them; and very great is the joy of such labourers, to see
 the sheep already come into the fold to feed with them, and
 solace among them, in what quart^r of y^e earth, or part of the

 they were at Hamborg as formerly, all thowdoyth had great
 openess, when I stayed about a week had 6 meetings; upon y^e 1st
 day 2 thowdoyth two roaker f^ro. dutcher of Holyoyn. about a dozen
 people, one attended upon by y^e rest. they entered y^e meeting about y^e 1st
 meeting through, w^{ch} held till half one. very sober, & went away very
 heartously, I think in y^e meeting & about windows & down was about forty
 hundred people, a large meeting againe in y^e afternoon; 30^r clars was
 & a young man w^{ch} went out of Cornwall to accompany mee. my love is to all
