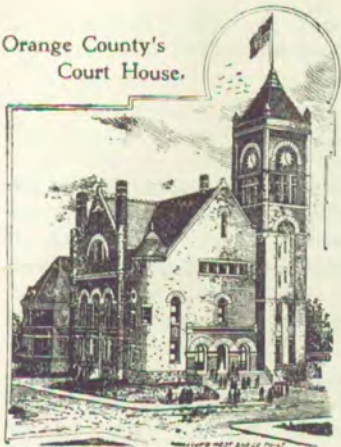

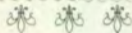
ORLANDO

THE "Phenomenal City," of South Florida, 150 miles South of Jacksonville, asks your attention for a moment. It is the capital of Orange county, a county with a thousand lakes. A public library has recently been established. The ladies have a "Sorosis," and a society club, the "Rosalind." We have a well appointed Opera House.

How Orlando Can Be Reached.

IT has two well equipped railroad systems entering it, namely: THE ATLANTIC COAST LINE and SEABOARD AIR LINE. It can also be reached by the St. Johns river, connecting with the A. C. L. at Sanford, or write to R. Edgar Dann, and you will be met at the wharf with teams and will be taken over one of the prettiest drives in Florida, that is between Sanford and Orlando. It can also be reached by the Ocklawaha River, connecting with the Seaboard Air Line at Silver Springs.

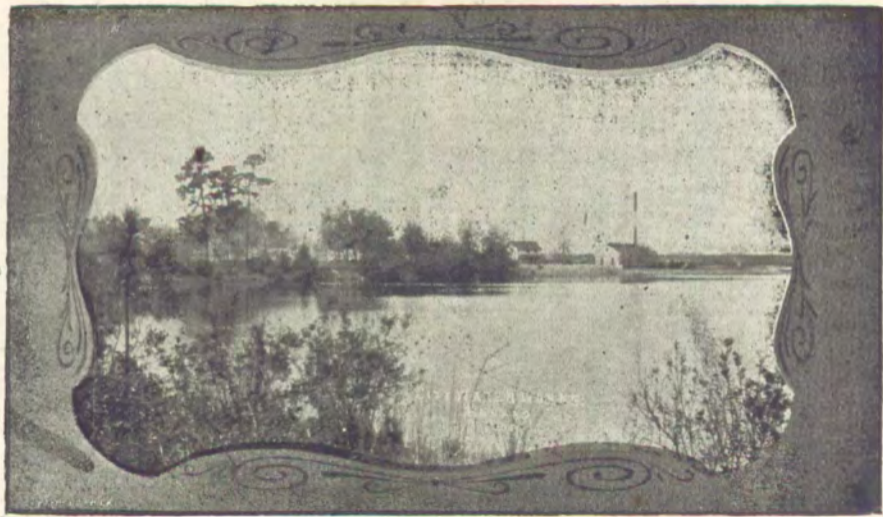

ORLANDO'S WATER SUPPLY.

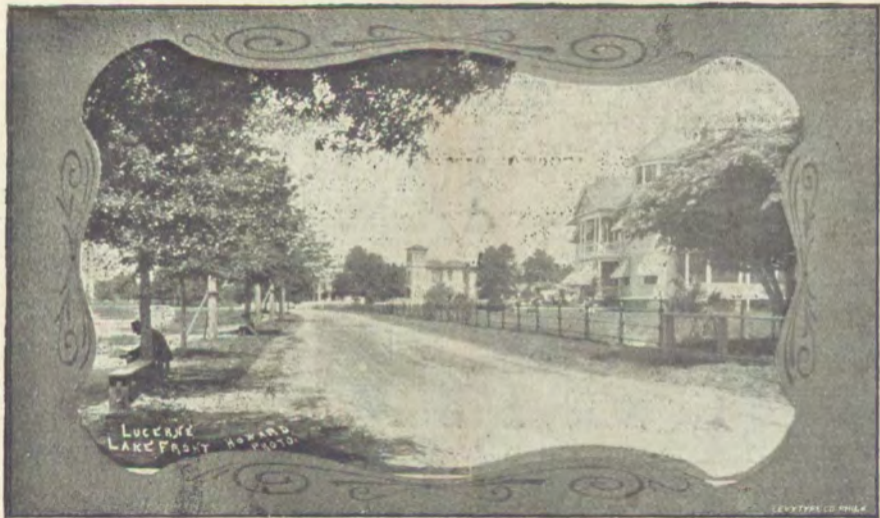
