Free Gold Open Access publishing under Gold for Gold Initiative



UCF Libraries is partnering with the Royal Society of Chemistry to support free "Gold Open Access" publishing under RSC's "Gold for Gold" initiative. As a subscribing institution to RSC's Gold Package, UCF Libraries has a limited number of vouchers to offer UCF researchers for open access publishing on a first-come/first-served basis. Each voucher code can be used to publish a communication, full paper, or review under RSC's Gold Open Access option, without paying the normal article publication fee. Citation Management

Need a place to store your citations? Try one of the libraries' citation management programs, Endnote or RefWorks. Easily export citations from library databases and Google Scholar. Then organize these citations for your research projects or share references with colleagues. Finally the best part...let the programs create your in-text citations and bibliographies! RefWorks is web-based and Endnote is available on your desktop, online and on your iPad.
