




Traditional Teaching




An instructor lectures

Students take notes, memorize, and complete rote exercises



How many of us have seen this in the classroom?



Students are more engaged with language acquisition when there is communication purpose and collaboration

Collaborative activities create communication purpose, stimulate students, and allow them to play an active role in their learning (Claxton, 2008, as cited in Ghanbaran & Ketabi, 2014).

Collaborative activities simulate incidental learning outside formal teaching environments (Suarez, 2016).

Learning is Implicit (Ellis, 1994): Students learn from their peers in a process which takes place naturally, simply and without conscious operation.







To become proficient, ESL students still need to learn proper grammar and syntax






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One more takeaway before we conclude

- Stay away from content that is extremely controversial.
- Political and socially volatile topics can detract from the purpose of language learning.
- Students focus on the issue and lose focus on language learning





Conclusion:

- Al is a powerful tool for generating more engaging ESL exercises.
- The ease with which AI generates engaging material can encourage instructors to generate more engaging curricula

However

- Al makes mistakes, even with graphics
- Instructors must check accuracy!






Stressed Alex is also based on U-Curve Hypothesis, context to which our student relate
