my verie deare and well beloved friend in the Lord Iesus Christ, in whom we have Rest and repose for ever more, who is the Rock and foundation of all our freese springs, and hath begotten vs by his own everlasting power, ward and deare care vnto another, and in this kinde and life is my salutation vnto thee, and all deare friends in these parts of the world, god all mighty be with you all, Bless and prosper you for ever more faith my soule, and now deare y<sup>r</sup> of Retained thine dated the 13. of the 6. mo. which I was verie glad of, and sur- shall be, to heare of your well being, and also of Thomas green being with you, and also of your settlement of deare with you and Roger Haydock all which I was verie glad to heare of, that you might be Refreshed to gather in the Lord, for deare heart by this few lines thou may understand that I am verie well Blessed by the name of the Lord whose power and mercies are far more our all sea and land god Blessed for ever, I have bene now shew the nation and have had good fortunes, and friends are generally well and meetings full and large, and manie coming in, and all is at a stand, and through all this the Lord is making way for his truth and people, and all will work together for good to them, that serves the Lord his truth and people, and for friends have no cause to be dismayed or cast down for the Lord is with vs, and no weapon formed against his appointed shall prosper, the mouth of the Lord hath spoken it, for deare y<sup>r</sup> my heart is full of the Lords love towards you, whom I have labor'd amongst, my Coes our flaws and my soule doth desire in the Remembrance of you, desiring your growth and prosperitie, and ever lasting well being, so let me heare from you as often as may be, I shall be glad, and if Thomas Atterton be with you, my deare love is to him, his wife and family are well, <sup>and I desire to heare from him,</sup> and if he be yet with you, I desire this to send me a little amber to smock, I think I may stay in this Countrey, a month or six weeks, and then I have some thoughts to go towards West- endion to Barbados or gamardia, and if this write before I go I shall be glad, and if not, thou write to Joseph Bodon in Brigs now in Barbados, for I have given thee an account, and desire this to remem- ber my love to all friends as if I did name them, so deare Jo: Claues and his wife Jo: Rantiff and his wife to Jacob Claues and his wife Barnit van songworen, and friends at Dausick Hambourgh - frederick stad <sup>and</sup> freestam, also more better due to deare mary and her Bro. if a line for god all mighty bless you all in this stormiall power and good of life of Righteousnes in whom all nations are blessed for ever more, for give more with my love to thee I take my leave and bid thee faire well
