I have found unto whom my love is unexpressable with
thy dear wife for truly there is not stop in the strings of my
love towards you therefore in the remembrance thereof my desire
to the Lord god of heaven & earth is that itt may abound you
and so you abound for ever and ever more I have found
things of the 11 of 9. 1685 is come to my hand with letters of attorney
and order of Court: but such without coming I had and some
at this manner things are now difficult than they would have
been but this may further inform that that James Harrison
both above to the age of 21 years the 11 of the 11th mo 1665
for she was 32 years the 11 of 11th mo 1665 so of long
suffering the time so short for that to art for her quiet
also now to give her for to show the execution for delivery
among the Courts to meet & to take them if they would call
in the manner pay me the money & would be bound
to show them from itt but not on the work of the Court
so thou may see what he hath writ to show him and what
further thou desires if the Lord will I shall be willing to
how it disposed on there is about two pound five shillings
with her ant lawch or under Aobathen Clams laid out in
provision for her for may let her signify her money
but that also I think there is 50 with her Clams
would have of her Grandfather but I think never got itt
so when she writ let her signify what she know of them and
doe James knowing thy desire to know how things are here in
short things are pretty calm and quiet and friends enjoy their
months nothing but we have twenty or twenty of our
self one of them being invited for visit vout & what full
or do: also by this I thought good to let the know that brother
Nathaniall hath had his part the Court now have agreed it
part for him but Henry had vout all warington: Roger
Longworth is gone for Avdland: so in that never saying
love with the Lord hath pleased in our hearts and to words
that and towards all men: do I take love bid the said with and
we must thy truly lovinge friend and brother Godfrey Harrison
to Henry before his wife with order Thomas Harrison: and
you can send your letters by the next ship for the letter call itt
the 26th of October 1686
