the truth, and my life in it ^{Love} rather for the wife bleed, and
to thy dear wife, for you are near, and dear to me
and the Breath of life, often runs through me, for your
suffocation and in way, and in the arms of divine ^{Love}
I dearly salute you, my well beloved in the Lord Jesus
Christ, and now dear friend by these few lines, thou
may understand, our journey to York on the first day was
started with thee, we went to Raverton, and next to
the River upon the 2d, and the next day to Essex
for me, and on the next morning took boat for York
and came into the meeting, and the Lord was with
and we had a good meeting, I ordered my maid to
be brought on the second day to Raverton: by one that
went in our Company, she was with us at workers
who promised, to be careful of her, I all so write to
thee, that she would be there on the second day at
night, which I hope she was, I was troubled to
send to thee, to salute her, but I could not either
give order it, I hope she will come safe, if thou
can send me a line or two, so far as I get a way I shall
glad I hope to get in three weeks time, for no more
but my dear one more to thee thy father-in-law
and mother, and all friends I rest in love
