 and Nathaniel Altherton sent all that same time -
 which he took of John Mason for Phineas & gave
 it to Henry Hadock & he promised to give it to his
 Brother and my master says he will pay for half
 a holpe of wood and 3 weeks table and
 more I have to you William Walker mabe man
 his kind love to you & Robert Lowrey's Richard Siddall
 and Richard Mather Junior Remember his kind love to you
 & to his Brother Joseph and as for I hope I think I have
 of good reason for goods ill shot at if we had when you
 were here for this year it more then it was last year I
 shall return very near as much as you & I was worth to
 Potter Solbourn has left things to his Brother James
 Allforn & now says to Henry son and Susan Parr widow
