Esteemed friend the letter of the 15<sup>th</sup> 7<sup>th</sup> received & according to the order I have paid John Haydock twenty two pounds nine shillings ten pence: the full balance of the acct I have ordered to be paid to him which I suppose hee will send unto thee; these few I did not speak to Nathaniel Island nor therefore reception; can you give any judgement for sending our goods or transport ourselves to live in that place: is it very pleasant & health full country the ground any thing like cleared from timber; is there of Cattel ~~any~~ it doe they live upon clover or hay: is there plenty of wheat rye barley oats beans & pease: doe they yield plentifully; I have a prospect land bought by Edward Wharton lies in Newson by Billaway bay: woods (partly) Contenant; would it be worth while to send on to settle; I should be glad to hear from thee my very hearty & kind love from
