Dear

Liverpool 20th 5th mo 1600

By how thou may know by G. night above the fight came away we went to sea & came to Anchor short of black rock that night north morning about it ^{we} were struck upon a sand bed & was forced to stay there until after a full night in which time the wind came contrary & drove us back to G. town so G. we came of board before 9 & is, ^{the night} the wind all present glands contrary & shall give thee further out of our passing as soon as I can, my dear love salutes thee, & thy little ones I am very well every way but I hope we get away quickly & shall be going to have a mind to be with thee & dear love to father & mother & to father from Bolton when thou writes or sends to him, I have the fight did not go out of town so soon as he expected me yesterday it was if he came home in good order, it was one of G. clock afore he went from home what hour it was when he came home, my love is our family's not his but am thy truly loving husband
provided by the fight

I bought some loose sugar of best sort ^{promised from Bolton} the other 6th & a round of Brandy it costs 38^s 5^d 6^g 1/2
12th of best loaf it costs 68^s 6^d 6^g

but I suppose notes may come with them fare well
Henry Baker ^{that} boy is buried that day ^{Boyle} Longworth love to you all
I have been sick already all sea & vomited twice we anchored on the sand bed & G. waves rise & tossed the ship so G. passengers were extraordinary sick
I have sent A Copy of the sugar baker bill enclosed
we are again now going to sea being about 400 night
