Dublin Dec 27th 1600

Dear

Wife & truly beloved, how by thou mayest know by: I am well
I had 500 the goods I took with me to the Alston the former
small offit, & had intentions home ward this week, but this day
I saw a letter from on William Matthews near foraine
Cam to that Turner do say that he heard last 2nd day
that Haydock was so ill at Carrick verging to be no more
where upon he & 2 other friends went to visit him, & do say
he is better & hopes he may get through it, I have proly
must desire to see him, it may be I may go this week (I about
do miles from this place) to visit him, however I shall not make
absolute conclusion, I hope may have something from ^{him} post to-
morrow, & then may better know what to do, but if I go abroad
at my return, if I be well & nothing prevent me I know not of
to get home wards as soon as wind & shipping permits, therefore
do not write after this comes to thy hand, I have not
any letter from thee at yet,
Dec 27th 1600

The bearer not going away when he might give me the more
time for finishing my letter, this day there is no letter com'n
from Roger Haydock nor friends there away w^{ch} makes us hope
he do recover therefore do now doubt my seeing of him
here for if I should go & he be removed (as I believe
will make but short stay after he is of ability to stir
about) it would be a great disappointment my dear love to fa-
ther & father in law & mother & little ones Anna Abigail & the
rest of the family & to friends in general, so I & his
wife when thou sees them hope long work can not get a
long stay w^{ch} would be for going shortly ~~to~~ (towards our
dear friend R.H.) it doore love to you all & friends of
our meeting, as soon as I can I will be home wards as
soon but will be fuller satisfied about R.H. afore I come if
possible, I have not else to add but that I am thy truly
loving husband
