and the children deare love to you both hoping you and your  
family are me be in health as was at that time I was  
be thoue most hid for the same so if desire thee to mind my dea  
re love to y h and his deare wife and to let her if inquired for  
the glad and eem but no glad if late had but ayed in som if send  
by my sister and for the if desire thee to remember my deare  
love to william yardley and his wife and family and let  
mee know how things goe with friend if and heu so hard on  
death and if hard of some led to be in the easton house  
of if if but the would not restore it to me or you  
ayed the damage and send it away so hoping to have
