with a fully refer that makinge not doubt but thou
hast asent of the imputation of my love unto you
with a pray god continue with increase for ever more
my deare friend these of the 9th of the 11th mth 1682
came to my hand with was truly very exalted
ble thy account therein concluded ^{by most lovers} very movent in
the relation to the Country as to things here as to
servings & such like the bearer can give as full an
account as I can write but as to our friend Asat
elston he is returned but Thomas Crosbys wife
hath layd downe the body & as to brother Nathaniel
he hath every full part as far as I do know ^{at this}
both turn to account but hath not lost any att Boulton
att vattise he hath ther accounts ofitt what I knowe
the Custome as far as I knowe ther had att Boulton do conti-
nue to Nathaniel so handlinge given that this short account
with my very deare love to deare Roger Longworth my
love to Eliza Winton they have sent also her trunk
but lost her hath be kind discharge as you have opportunity
to have from you wist thy Loving friend & brother
in the love
