Arday in Blakerod the last day of the 4th month 84

Deare Phinias my very deare & unfained loue at this time is with thee, & in
the feeling of that loue which unitse us as one, though we are ceperated outwardly
I do dearely saluie thee, & having this oportunitie I could do no lesse but write a
fewe lines unto thee my lines hand also being very desirouse to haue his loue which is to
thee very true signified unto thee, thou being so often afresh in his remembrance he
hath wished many times that he could write for thy sake, that he might sometimes
send a line or two as a token of his loue which neither the breadth of sea or land
hath at all lesned, neither doth he becene time can ever weare out. because the truth
which was the seede is the reneware of that loue which is in god & of god & it doth not
wax out as doth a garment, but as the truth is sealed by him, & thou in it brought
into his mind, thou art very neere him so that he can embrace thee as in the arme
of diuine loue where life springs which refreshes the whole heritage of god
every where, in which place is our desire we may all be found & for ever
preserved though outwardly we are farre remote yet inwardly we may be
kept as neere as the very embrace of one body of which christ is the head
& indeed we are satisfied concerning thee whereere thou art, that thou art a me
mber of the true body & hath thy nourishment from the true head, & that is it
we know that will keep us all as one unto god & in unity with him, & also very neere
& deare one to another in the enjoyment of which let our soules for the same bless
the lord whise we haue a being,
& now deare friend we desire thee to remembare our very deare loue to thy deare wife
& little ones we heare they weare both asine & well, when thou writ a letter to tenary
also mind our deare loue to thy father in lawe & mother & graunmother if the be yet
aline also to thy father & mother & the maid which went with you
we desire thee to mind our deare loue to roger jony worth if he be in those parts,
also if thou haue oportunitie to see John woods let him know our loue is to him his wife
& father & now my friend as to newse I haue nothing in my mynd to writ
for I know if there be any thing of matter, there is other friends will writ
we haue a little daughter her name is Hannah she is a very knowing child
being she is not out one yeare & a halfe out & could haue got her selfe neere
twenty weeks since she can spake most of common words though not very
plainly
saluie thy mother in lawe once more with my deare loue
my loue is with thee who am thy friend & sister in truth & righteousnesse
Hannah loue

Elisabeth. Wishing both her deare loue to all four mentioned

my deare friend Phinias Pemberton my loue move to thee
remembared desiring thee to let mee heare from thee
when thou hadt oportunitie to go with my loue to thee
and to little abigall and all the best
