from the waight of Ireland with <sup>part</sup> of y<sup>e</sup>  
goods sent: 25-barrels of beef 500 lb of Butter  
& some Candles - if letter directed to thee & mee  
depend. it & doo and or found of woffee put into  
now yorke & if provisions are in a shop -  
Condinge this way - I thought fitt to advise thee -  
& must desire thee when these things are sent -  
to lett me have about 2-barrels of Beef  
Jam Straightened - & faint to buy fresh Beef  
for at least 17 - persons - because; our family  
have ben much disordered this yeare  
with sickness - & I may sell for things  
wrongd - I desire thee give if enclosed to James  
Road Gardner - if if things arrive here I  
Intend to take care of y<sup>e</sup> - Thy friend
