Thomas Jansy and Phenike Pemberton  
my Dear love is to y<sup>e</sup> both and to y<sup>e</sup> wife I hope may  
Let you understand that I gott a passage to Philadelphia  
and had intentions to com by to you but the boat will  
not stay so I cannot now see you but have here  
with about you three pound of silver money  
I hope will supply you untill I doo com and then  
I shall with our own sloop bring you some tobacco  
some corn but for meate it is very hard to be had  
by Reason it grows not mass your Desire that  
Thomas Jansy may be paid out of all his dow which I  
think is about 40: by Reason of transportation of tobacco  
and Coen is troublesome but I doo know that to y<sup>e</sup>  
own ordering: I have also brought a small Bagge  
of wooll for Lidia wharmby and I have left it at  
20: Lords street and he will deliver it to whom  
I doo order therefore I have here under writ  
a note which I would have Linnas to fill up  
and send by some opportunity for it: our sloop  
yo may Inform if Geny Howard will be by with  
Lading in some short time if the frost will not  
otherwise not till after y<sup>e</sup> frost doo break by  
desire you to Acquaint friends and my bro: and sister  
how that my wife is very well and desires to be  
remembred to them as mine to yo and y<sup>e</sup> I am  
friends to my Ability  
Philadelphia y<sup>e</sup> 25<sup>th</sup> 1686
