Friend James Harrison

After many wth my wisest kinde love to thee thy wife and
family these words to be forme thee be as thine
of James Thomas, and on this time I hope thou hast sold
my good but by him the last voiage to my profit and
content, and I hope thou hast Conferred the Land
in my name that I bought of John Edmonson according
to the Custom of yo^r party and for all and every of
my charges I will Allow thee, and if none here in word
gett safer none until thou heary further from me, wth
I be down to my profit and my Lett of Land in the
towne I desire thee pale in and my wite Records as
is use in my name I hope if God permit to be in
yo^r party a while the next fall wth I go on to please
my selfe in the purchase of a small plant, but I
hope my Request to thee in this Letter wth I
shal fill, if not pray to be as Expedition as possible
for the Accomplishment of the same for thy
Truly Loving Friend Andrew Duncanson
