and these are all his apperrell that there is and all there was only some few course cloths & his shoes were used in the Governor's house which had they not been used they would have been spoiled and this Jo: Cookery can give an account how matters stand as to his estate I wish you were here to manage it you are a widow I have nothing but trouble with it & am a widow and have business enough of my own hand drudgery & slavery but with the cloths to keep them as they are & other matters relating to his concern, and yet it grieves me to see you & your boy on one hand and you on the other call for your loggins & your boy would have his and you say you are dead & yet there is no doubt of it nor do I but for fear of those taking more harm I send them but shall send nothing till they be cleared by the Governor and other persons of to whom money is due divers persons. He charges double to him in his book but there is none will own any thing & I can make no proof therefore little like to be got of what out of greatly desire to be discharged of the burden that lies on me about it who am your friend

 yet for it I shall be accountable
