do not hope no year or add but no person will continue any longer in the  
separation made by him & his party here or give way to that evil  
spirit that had them hereto & has prevailed upon them but return  
that unity with of the bond of our peace and that love which thinks no  
evil & to dwell in him in whom we do no offence

the and men of well & amicable settlement duties respects to be settled in Pennsylvania  
& live in England and if the Lords state order & make way for some of you  
who know the affairs of truly in Pennsylvania you to come over to our next yearly  
meeting we believe also it will be of good service & an pleasure amongst friends and  
Brethren of the nation for in true love we desire ever to remain your friends
