Feb 25<sup>th</sup> / mo 95

I write from Burlington at my going down & acquainted them of what I heard by a letter to your Bibles the friends are here & James Goringe the friends viz: R. Barrow & R. Wardle intend to be at popoym the 12<sup>th</sup> of the next month at Newshamiah the 14<sup>th</sup> at the falls the 16<sup>th</sup> at Graywood the 18<sup>th</sup> at Burlington the 21<sup>st</sup> day this day they go to Newtown to the meeting to be there tomorrow the next day to Darby untill those meetings be over I think to accompany them yesterday we had a very full & large meeting but over all the conference pass'd away like a cloud this day we have an att taken to be from good ground that the R. of E is dead the R. of France & the Duke of Luxembourg the R. of St. general I have her enclosed sent this that was a rare a Church of England <sup>prince</sup> vindicator friends & busy agt their opposors thou mayest find more in B. vno & sure as thinks fitt for ~~the~~ the enclosed

Sam<sup>l</sup> Carpenter not as yet returned out of many lands nor expected untill latter end of this week therefore untill his return thou mayest not expect either my return home or any further account from me but in a weeks time hope to be with thee or that thou mayest hear from me

As to the plantation affairs I wold have thee send for what oaks & Bibles or G. Brown will spare me but I fear I can't get them home & when they will be scarce, but let the fence of the barley ground be moved to the out side & got up; the barley sowed after the ground is dry, but its not to purpose to sow whilst the ground is so wet as it is let thrashing of all sorts of graine be put forward by the square of fence & plowing expedited when the land is fit for it if I conclude to stay I shall then send up my bill for what I want next week & may let the boxes stay untill then except the fleet wares call for them, & then if the water be good & the gods not likely to take damage thou mayest send them

I am well & shall be glad to hear thou & ours are the same call James Biles I have sent the pot of agut mt it cost 6<sup>s</sup> 6<sup>d</sup> viz what shee gave me

my endeared to love is to thee my Dear, only & our friends who are thine in that way changes not
