I am troubled that that release sealed by Ringard and
 Jane Lundy is lost, or cannot be found I have write to
 Ringard Lundy that he and Jane be at the meeting att
 Wm. Biles next 4th day to seal another afore write
 Janney Ringard though p. Henry Baker if they all happen
 to be there if not some other sufficient friends that write
 their names to witness it what they are to seal is Rowe
 enclosed thou needst to do nothing to it but to let them
 seal it sign it & deliver it to thee for the use aforesaid
 & get the witnesses to subscribe their names to it, and
 bring it with thee when thou comes downe wth report
 will be when write comes & wth also have thee to bring with thee
 the County Seals which thou will find on the Closet table or
 on the narrow shelves over it under where the double books
 are kept to lye, I know nothing to write in relation to planta
 tion affairs or otherwise but leave all until thou come from
 thine in the bye of that endeared love wth the power of death can
 not break ^{the} frailty of flesh is just that that power may
 prevail as the winter to chill the warme rays thereof
 but the root lyes hid by the hand of some provident in
