John Adams went from hence, I wrot a few Lines,
Intending to Sam: Jonnings by him; but I foaskoot,
in Delivring: And I know not any opportunity till now;
and this is by a friend; one Tobias Dymock, who I hope
may Deliver it with his own hand, and Give you Sect:
of our Affairs: for hath Knowledge of most Publike
things in those parts. Jonathan Tyler hath bin from
hence, in the Eastern parts of this Country, several
months; And we hear of good flockings to him.

This Country, has a wise professing People in it; And
they ~~that~~ that Com hence, may not be Novices:

yet we want skilful Labourers; that Can
Divide things aright: for utterance, is a good help
to Knowledge; to set forth things to others: for
many have a Blessed Knowledge, and a Light in the
Knowledge; but want an utterance, when the
fluent Tongue, many Times, goes beyond its Knowledge.
That is, Little favour in its Tongue utterance, though
words of Truth: wherefore Let favour be gained;
that Gives favour to words: for he that is
in the favour, can say words as the mouth say
meals. Ministry, in the words of Truth, that
hath not the favour of Truth, is as the Chaff
to the wheal; which once were together, but now
must be Divided; for what is the Chaff to the
wheal? My Love to Deare Thomas Jannoy
and Goodwife Owen, if Com; for I Love them;
and many more among you, whose favour
Remains: For the sweetness of the favour
we cannot but Love and an other: which is
the first and the Last. Farewell. Dan: Gould.
