Dear Phinias my very dear love Dear by salute
Thee and thy dear Children whom I truly and unfeign-
ly love and am nearly concerned for their welfare and
have much in my mind to them but have not time at
present I have not a quarter of an ounce of time to write in
but am loth to miss sending a few lines where by thou
may know we are all at present well my Dear Mother
if you got well home and found all things well, my Dear
Father and unfeignly beloved friend Phinias. thou art very
dear and near to me I greatly long to see thee and as
this summer I have had some expectation of it in
much that I think hardly as yet has paid but I
have had some representations of going of thee other
ways I would more desire to see thee no I think thou
wast never more near me than thou art yet thou art
very near me I very often think of thee with much
tenderness and great love, where with shall I express my
self time will tell, love it is all and on that I know
thou wilt regard it in which I rest giving to thee
and thyne a fresh salutation and kiss of unfained love
but shall I omit acknowledging thy fatherly care which
has been mine is so great and I still continu'd to us
for which I am not able nor can never be able to make
agufficient returne but looke upon my self a
while I have a King thereof my dear Phinias who has
been as a tender father and so I truly honour thee
I pray thee to put upon me any thing that may be
for thy eye or benefite any way upon the account of
thy younger Children I will do to the utmost of my
power for them and looke upon my selfe obliged to
doe Dear Phinias I have not

Left expecting to see these letters written and I perceived some of your letters to stay a while
with us I hope you will not forget by what we can have more my love and care
and I am sure you will not be so negligent to love your children with the same love as you
