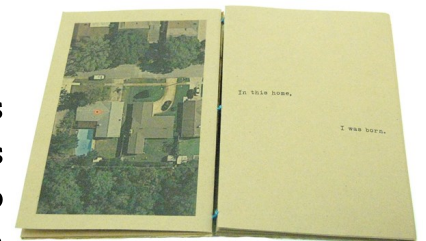


Help the Libraries select furniture for the new 5th floor Quiet Study Zone!
