 also sent the land suit & the spinning wheel & 1 bag has
 in one end 1 bag: of wheat meal & in the other end 1 bag
 of Rye meal I have no acct of any thing you desire
 whether you desire it or no I take in my last several
 questions as how your corn & meal hold out how you did
 for money whether thou had flax with thee & several other
 things but no answer to any of them but Israel go to win
 Breovan or thou & bespeak me a good pair of winter shoes
 ayt I come & 1 pair for Ben & I shall pay for them but get
 them ayt: this weeks end if possible or beginning of the next
 but please learn her book a pair & then when she has learnt
 enough she may come home & be my maid I have sent down
 3 shillings to be Israel wapt Cule & Breaned & ~~some~~ flannel for
 Lymmy ^{where} I have sent with them flax for these all in a bag w^o for
 the bags be sent or no there is no account as whether in your
 letters to my questions & shall true I have not time now to write what
 necessary being ready to go into my
