Honored father I have reserved thy letter which giveth  
An account of some bags what bags I know not for Thomas Ro  
hark not been hear since thou went up I reserved one old bag  
with 2 cheeses which thou sent by mathew Robinson I A hath  
sent se coward of wood and ~~oll~~ paid him 70 shilings the hay  
came that night that I seel fel it so I could not take that core as  
I could at A nother time and hit was put into mary. Yours stable  
and shee had let hit out to John crap and hee put his horses in  
and they eat a great deale of it before I knew and had intended  
to let them eat hit all but as nathan sinberee was sociid as to send mee  
word when he knew but hit was that day weik after S Nubee when  
hee bought word hee promised to send a negrow with hit for I could  
him that I could not tel how far to send for hit because my brother  
was sick Robt Ho hath sent A pin and hit must bee given her  
at night when shee goeth to bed and shee must bee kept veri warm  
must not dring enything that is coul and I have inclosed it in  
the letter Robt Quin is dead he died yester day in the morning  
and his youngest child is dead all so no more at present but  
ourer dutfull respects so I conclude thy dutifull Daughter  
Abigail Pemberton pray remember my kind love to as  
many as shall ask after us James and Ben and Bet

if thou could send turnops or eny thing  
els it would bee exceptible to bile with  
H salt meat
