yester day I writ to thee by Saunt Jennings afore I  
 writ by Jos Kirkbride & by Wm Gules besides oyer letters  
 but he forgot by Joseph Kirkbride to tell thee I had bespoken  
 a girl for a maid for thee if he had brought her up to see  
 her, if he be comen back from Philadelphia & bring her  
 her not, afore this comes to hand enquire of him  
 about her, I doubt it will be the middle of the next  
 weeke afore I get home if I come not home afore  
 send down the horse daily by the: about the time of  
 high water at Buckingham next 4<sup>th</sup> day & so daily till  
 I come this comes by the Gouerny. I doubt will  
 not come to hand until the first day next except  
 oblige take care about it who had had two opportunity  
 & give me no account of your well faire I am  
 indifferent well & long to be with thee w<sup>ch</sup> I hope  
 will be ere long & that makes the time more long  
 until it come, lett George give the cattle a small  
 matter of hay for two mornings lest they shrink too  
 much on a suddain I think thou must keep the deafe of  
 the Bullcock he will shrink I conclude as I usually do in  
 Rest thinde in end send Love
